

1. Exception Scoring Adjustment

A player who during the calendar year, beats CSS by 4 or more on 2 occasions in a singles competition, will have their handicap further decreased by a value that is calculated by the system. This adjustment will be applied immediately following the 2nd competition.

(Clause 23C – Page 45 & 46). **BIG CHANGE FOR MEMBERS**

Examples: (assuming CSS of 36)

Example 1: Player A has 40 points in Competition 3 of 2012
 Player A has 43 points in Competition 6 of 2012
 Beats CSS by average of 5.5 (4+7) divided by 2
 So 5.5 in a sequence of 4 Comps is a cut of 2.0

Example 2: Player B has 40 points in Competition 3 of 2012
 Player B has 43 points in Competition 9 of 2012
 Beats CSS by average of 5.5 (4+7) divided by 2
 So 5.5 in a sequence of 7 Comps is a cut of 1.0

Example 3: Player C has 41 points in Comp 1 of 2012
 Player C has 40 points in Comp 9 of 2012
 Beats CSS by average of 4.5 (5+4) divided by 2
 So 4.5 in a sequence of 9 Comps is a cut of 0.5

Example 4: Player D has 41 points in Comp 1 of 2012
 Player D has 41 points in Comp 11 of 2012
 Beats CSS by average of 5 (5+5) divided by 2
 So 5 in a sequence of 11 Comps is “No Change”

The Exceptional Scoring clause is not applicable to Category 1 golfers and can only reduce a player's handicap to a minimum of 5.5.
